Series on Peter Continues

This Lent we are focusing on the life and faith of one of Jesus' most famous disciples. Peter in the Gospels is a faithful yet flawed disciple of Jesus. In many ways, his faith journey reflects our own journeys with Jesus.

Sunday services will continue to focus on key themes in Peter's life. You're invited to join us <u>and</u> to invite someone to share this time with you. Contemporary worship is offered in Atchley Hall at 9:30 am every Sunday, and Traditional worship is available in the Sanctuary at 11:00 am. All our services are streamed live on our Facebook page and our YouTube channel.

During **Holy Week**, when we remember Jesus' final week, we'll observe some special services. On **Maundy Thursday, March 28**, at 7:00 pm, we'll remember Jesus' last supper with his disciples through the eyes of Peter. He will refuse to have his feet washed by Jesus, pledge his undying loyalty, and then deny Jesus. On **Good Friday, March 29**, at 7:00 pm, we'll reflect on Jesus' suffering and death on the cross, paying attention to Peter's involvement.

We'll celebrate the Resurrection of Jesus on **Easter Sunday, March 31**, with services at 9:30 am and 11:00 am. Join us as we explore the surprising news that "Jesus is alive" through the eyes of Peter with the message "And I Hope."

This series provides a great opportunity to invite someone to church with you. Wherever they are on their faith journey, they can discover God's grace in the life of Peter. Through his story, we'll all reflect on the stages of our own faith journeys and recognize who and what have shaped us along the way. May we rest in streams of mercy never ceasing.

Air Conditioning Update
