Although confirmation is not a sacrament in The United Methodist Church, it is an important marker along our spiritual journeys.

At baptism, we are initiated into the new covenant in Jesus Christ and membership in the Church, Christ's body in the world. For many, this happens when they are very young.

Confirmation is an opportunity to respond to the grace of God available to us, as acknowledged in baptism, and to promise to live as a person of faith. Confirmation is our






different worshiping communities made when faced with the choice of life (through change) or death (through closing).

## By Popular Request


Participants in past Bible studies here at Monroe UMC asked to learn more about what is probably the most puzzling and intimidating book for readers of the Bible: the book of Revelation. You asked for it, you've got it.

Starting on Wednesday, January 8, 2025, 1:00-3:00 pm, at Monroe UMC, we will host a study of the book of Revelation. We'll read the text together. We'll seek to understand what it meant to its first readers (including those in the seven churches to which the letter is addressed) and ponder what it might mean for us today. We'll examine some myths (or misunderstandings) about Revelation, strive to interpret the symbols, discover what it tells us about Jesus, and seek how it fits into our lives and our world today.
